Did You Know?:

- Oklahoma recently began requiring high school seniors to pass 4 out of 7 end-of-instruction tests before they can earn a diploma. But last year the state cut funding from a program that provides extra help for students struggling to pass the tests.
- Oklahoma will soon require children who do not pass a reading test to be retained in the third grade. However, in 2012 the state zeroed out more than \$6 million in funding meant to help students meet these new requirements. Oklahoma also eliminated \$3 million in funding for Literacy First, a proven program for reading instruction.
- State aid funding has dropped by \$224 million since 2008, even as public school enrollment increased by 36,000 students. Many schools are cutting teaching positions to cope with budget cuts.
